Sharing the Gospel Luke 6:39-42

Jesus tells a parable in this week's Gospel 'Can the blind lead the blind?' We are the 'blind leading the blind' if we try to help or influence others when we don't understand Jesus' teachings or when we aren't willing to examine our conscience and change our own behaviour. Jesus uses humour to invite us not to take ourselves too seriously. Imagine a log in your eye and then try to take a speck out of another's eye. It can be a common weakness to judge my neighbour while not recognising my own faults and need of God's mercy. Do I make a practice of thinking the best of other people? Do I challenge my habit of making quick judgments about others?
