OUR FAITH

Sharing the Gospel Luke 9:11-17 The Feast of the Body & Blood of Christ

The Gospel tells the story of the miraculous feeding of the five thousand and is both a teaching on the Eucharist and on Jesus' way of relating with people.

It has Eucharistic significance: his meal is one of miraculous abundance for all. Jesus does not produce the food out of nowhere. He takes what little the apostles have and multiplies it a thousand fold. This reminds us that no matter how little we may think we have to give, if we place our gifts freely in Jesus' service they become limitless.

The Eucharist as a sacrifice and meal involves us not simply in a prayerful ritual but also commits us to a way of relating to each other. If we are truly devoted to the Lord's presence in Holy Communion then we will also be truly devoted to his presence in the community, especially in those who are most in need.

PENTECOST GATHERING

Last Monday we all gathered in the Parish Centre to celebrate Pentecost and the birthday of the Church. We remembered the Ascension of Jesus and Pentecost with children acting out the gospel stories. We prayed that like the disciples we too can be filled with different gifts and know that the Holy Spirit Te Wairua Tapu lives in us as part of the Church today.








OUR PEOPLE
