
Sharing the Gospel Matthew 18:21-35 The Parable of the Unmerciful Servant

Then Peter came up and said to him, "Lord, how often shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? As many as seven times?' Jesus said to him, "I do not say to you seven times, but seventy times seven."

The story in this Sunday's Gospel is one of forgiveness. There is no limit to the number of times we are called to forgive and be merciful. If we must be prepared to forgive seventy-seven times, then we must also be ready to ask for forgiveness – and believe we are forgiven – seventy-seven times. The servant who was spared should be understanding and empathetic towards the other servant but instead refuses to forgive his debt.

The message of the story is to treat others the way you want to be treated and be generous of heart. Jesus expects his followers to forgive others because He first gave us mercy.




The Junior Joeys leading children in a Social Justice week liturgy and teaching the sign of the cross in Tongan.

Maths

This year two groups of children have been taking part in a Ministry of Education Accelerating Learning in Mathematics (ALiM) initiative. One of the goals of ALiM is to increase student agency and develop students' mathematical identities and dispositions.

These maths sessions have had a problem-solving basis and consisted of learning new strategies and deepening knowledge of a range of numeracy skills and concepts, which is how we teach mathematics at all levels at St Ignatius.





Today the groups took part in a fun and challenging problem-solving task which involved constructing pyramids and the algebraic thinking behind geometrical shapes.

Keeping children safe online
