Sharing the Gospel: Luke 24:35-48

In this Sunday's Gospel Jesus appears to his disciples. The passage continues the story of the two disciples who encountered the risen Christ on the road to Emmaus. They returned to Jerusalem to tell the others that they had seen Jesus. In the midst of their conversations, Jesus appears, offering peace. The disciples were terrified thinking that he was a ghost. While Jesus let them touch him, they were still incredulous and did not recognize him until after he shared a meal with them and spoke the words that helped them to understand the scriptures. The disciples touch him; they can see the marks of the wounds in his hands and feet and eat with him.

Ōrākei Moth Plant POD and Small Vines Competition 2021 Terms and Conditions

Most Pods and/or small vines with roots collected (Individual or Team)

Open to preschool, primary, intermediate, secondary

1st \$500

2nd \$400

3rd \$150

Spot Prizes – be in the draw by: (at least 50 pods and/or small vines with roots) AND with photo(s) or videos sent to pourewa@nwo.iwi.nz

Prize money will be in the form of a Cash Prize – paid to your school then school will forward prize money to winners

4x \$50- Thickest Vine Prize!

4x \$50 Spot Prizes

1. The student must be enrolled in a school or early childhood centre (ECC) within the Ōrākei Local Board area.
Entries are at the discretion of each school but we suggest:
Preschool adult to child ratio 1:1, Primary & Intermediate students must have at least 1 Adult per team (no more than 5 Adults per team). Teams are limited to 10 people per team (Adults and Students) inclusive.
2. Student/Teams **must be registered before Friday 16th April 2021 (midnight)** to register please visit: <https://tinyurl.com/ba685xms>
3. **Permission from the landowner** must be sought and granted before any pods are removed from vines on their property.
4. **Permission** must be sought and granted **from a parent or legal guardian** to take part in this competition.
5. All [Health & Safety rules and guidelines](#) must be adhered to.
6. All **Moth Pod Vine locations** that are found or visited, must be advised by emailing: [S.T.A.M.P at mothplantlocations@gmail.com](mailto:S.T.A.M.P@mothplantlocations@gmail.com) – **Please include a description of the current state of the vine / what action did you take?** eg. all pods removed, or vine pulled out, or root stem poisoned etc.
7. The **pods must be removed** from the vine to be eligible, each small vine removed by the roots counts as 1 moth plant pod.
8. Pods can only be removed if there is another person present - for safety reasons. Only attempt to remove pods that can easily be reached **from standing at ground level.**
9. **Gloves, a long-sleeved shirt and eye protection must be worn** while removing and/or handling any pods as **the sap can be an irritant.** Care must be taken to ensure the sap does not come in to contact with skin and/or eyes and **the pods cannot be eaten. Protect your clothes – sap will ruin your clothes! They are poisonous if eaten.**
10. The **number of pods, small vines** and the **identity of the student(s)** must be easily verifiable from the photo.
11. The photo(s) must be **submitted between Saturday 17 April 2021 and Sunday 2 May 2021 (midnight)** to the following email: pourewa@nwo.iwi.nz with **name or team name and 2021 Orakei Moth Plant Competition in the subject line** - Pods must be arranged in easily identifiable/countable groups of 50.
12. The photo must have been taken between the dates above.
13. In addition to the competition photo, each Team will be required to **submit a photo diary or short video 1-2 mins showing teams in action to be in the draw for a spot prize.** Submit your photo diary or short video to pourewa@nwo.iwi.nz
14. **Thickest Vine Prize** – to be eligible Team must submit 2 photo's – 1 before vine was cut and 1 after vine was cut at the root with a ruler beside vine to easily identify the vine width.
15. Student/teams can start collecting from 17 April 2021 they may send in multiple photos (no more than 1 photo per week) to prevent PODs and small vines rotting. If the team decides to do this, all photos must be taken with the Key Enviro Teacher present, to verify Pods were disposed of after each photo taken – Photos must be able to be date verified - Pods & Vines may be gathered from more than one location across multiple days; however, they must all be visible and laid out in easy

identifiable/countable groups of 50. A student may enter as part of a team or as an individual, but not both. All verified photos of PODs and vines will be added up to form a total entry amount.

16. The **“Most Pods Collected”** prizes will be drawn **first**. A student/team who claims one of these prizes is ineligible to win one of the Spot Prizes. Any student/team who does not claim a prize in the “Most Pods Collected” category will be automatically entered into the “Spot Prizes” category.
17. The **spot prize winners** will be **chosen randomly** from the pool of entries (excluding prize winners from the “Most Pods” categories). Entrants from each eligible school will be invited to attend the prizegiving at Pourewa 18 June 2021 at 4pm as well as receiving a plant for entering. The “Most Pods Collected” winners will be selected and confirmed by Ngāti Whātua Ōrākei staff.
18. Each entrant is eligible for a native plant if at least 20 pods are collected. Eligible entrants can collect the plant at Pourewa 18th of June. Entrants can either take the plant home or plant on Pourewa reserve.
19. The organizer(s) and supporters of this competition shall not be liable for any loss or damage suffered (including but not limited to indirect or consequential loss), or for personal injury suffered or sustained, as a result of participating in this promotion except for any liability which cannot be excluded by law.
20. **Entry into this competition is deemed acceptance of these Terms and Conditions.**
21. Once you have taken your photo with the pods, they can be disposed of in a plastic bag with your household’s weekly rubbish collection or at Pourewa Reserve (107 Keka road, entrance across from Kupe St. intersection) 26 April to 29 April 2021 from 4 to 6pm.
22. COVID-19 - This competition can only go ahead at Alert Level 1, any change in Alert Levels the competition will be cancelled.
